Northwest author uses fiction to challenge fundamentals of anthropology

Portland, Oregon – May 28, 2007

In his *Seeds Of Civilization* novels, R.J. Archer incorporates recent archaeological discoveries that point to civilizations more than twice as old as those of Egypt and Mesopotamia. Startling new evidence—recently released satellite photos and information published by underwater archaeologists—add to the growing evidence that advanced cities existed along low-lying coastal areas *all over the globe* before the waters rose after the last ice age. So why isn't anything being written about these discoveries and why aren't investigations being funded? Why do traditional anthropologists still tout the Middle East as the birthplace of civilization?

In the *Seeds of Civilization* novels, a Seattle aerospace engineer and his team of amateur investigators uncover these mysteries and come up with answers that are truly “out of this world.” An underlying theme in the novels is the growing split in the scientific community about the age and origin of Earth's earliest civilizations.

NWIDI Press now offers the first two novels, *Tractrix* and *Tsubute*, for **adolescent and adult summer reading**. After the 2006 re-release of *Tractrix*, originally published in 2004, the author's attention is now focused on a non-fiction report about MEGA—the lost city of Cuba—found submerged more than 2,000 feet below the surface in the Gulf of Mexico. One of the unique features of “Seeds Of Civilization” is that the archaeological mysteries at the core of each novel are very real. The origin and purpose of the Maya's knowledge of astronomy, the Yonaguni Monument, discovered by a scuba diver in 1987 and the “lost city of Cuba,” discovered by a Canadian salvage team in 2000, are all mysteries currently under investigation.
